CAPRD Meeting Minutes
June 16, 2010
City of Canby Planning Offices, 7:00

Previous meeting minutes were approved for May.

Bank Balance: \$652.00

Matilda provided further information on the possible range of costs for the community center/aquatics center on a spreadsheet that will allow us to examine different combinations of amenities and their corresponding costs. She also reported that the City Council has not finalized their strategy for funding the new police offices and library expansion. There was a brief discussion of how that might effect the CAPRD plans for a spring 2011 tax base and bond measure.

Chair Milne gave a report for the Fun Run organization. The run will take place on September 11, 2010 beginning at Baker Prairie School. We have reserved the school site, and have committed donations from Canby Telcom, Canby Pharmacy, Frank Bashor Supplies and Sherman Ink. Promotional inserts will be provided for inclusion in Canby Telcom and Canby Utility mailings. The Canby Food Bank was selected as our Fun Run charity recipient. Registration cost have been lowered from 2009, and we continue to request a donation of two cans of food with onsite registrations. He reported that he met with Bev of the Chamber of Commerce and asked her if she would be able to let her members know that we could still use volunteers at the event.

Future events for 2010-11 include a Civil War event in November at the Swim Center, an early January "Polar Bear" snowball challenge, and a early spring, sports equipment exchange event. The Board approved a motion 5-0, that directs Board Member Malloy to apply for a Nike Community Grant to promote and develop the sports equipment exchange event. The motion was made by Board Member Driggers, and seconded by Board Member Morgan.

The Board also approved a resolution supporting the Canby United Soccer Association's application to the Canby School Board, and for grant applications, that would lead to the development of six grass soccer fields at Baker Prairie and Trost Schools. The resolution was proposed by Board Member Driggers, and seconded by Board Member Morgan. The resolution passed 5-0.
